**Pastor's Weavings** A couple days ago I received a letter in the mail from my mother. She sent me a couple of pictures an old friend of mine passed on to her to send my way. I smiled back at my 18 year old self smiling into the camera in front of a grand old oak tree. Out of curiosity I showed the picture to my youngest son and asked him if he recognized the girl in the picture. He wasn't sure who it was but he said she looked like a 'Readel'. Ahh, family resemblance! He could see similar characteristics between me and my four sisters.

It sounds nice to hear that one resembles others in this world. A surprising joy hits us when we recognize similarities between us and other people on the planet, unless of course, we don't want to resemble the oddball in the family. This sense of difference leads us into the troubling territory of competition, jealousy and pride. The truth is that a family, even the human family is meant to find joy in how we are similar over and against how we are different. We are all made in the likeness of God, so we are much more alike than we want to recognize.

I reflect on this as I think of our Lutheran family. We share similarities more than we think and this should bring us joy. I reflect on this as I think of stirring up more conversations with St. Matthew's and that Anglican family on the east end of Marshall.
